In the name of God, Amen  
In Fulton County, I, John H. Gandy, Trustee of the County and  
State before said, being of sound and disposing Mind  
and Memory, and knowing the uncertainty of life  
and the Certainty of death, do hereby make Ordain  
and declare this my last will and testament, viz:

Item 1<sup>o</sup> I give my Soul to God who gave it, and  
my Body to the decently interred, in its Mother Earth  
accordable to my situation at the time of my death

Item 2<sup>o</sup> I rejected, being a violation of the law, this Statute

Item 3<sup>o</sup> Furthermore give and bequeath unto the said  
Agnes H. Gandy the balance of my Negroes which  
I may die possessed of, viz, Ned, Hannah, Harriet  
Ann, Charles, Mary, Matilda, Eliza, Martha, Caroline,  
Harvey, Little Liddy, Laura, Elizabeth, Charney, Zackie  
Mahy, John, Georgina, and their increase for his use  
and benefit during his life time and at his death to be  
equally divided between his Children.

Brown 4<sup>o</sup>, I give and bequeath to my beloved nephews  
Augustine Allmand and his wife Letitia, on the first part  
of lot of land on which I now live known as lot No 5 Main  
St, in the fourteenth district of originally Henry Co.  
Fulton County and State aforesaid, And to my beloved  
Nieces Mahala Hudson and Amanda Wells I give  
and bequeath to each, the remaining two thirds to be equally  
divided share and share alike between the said August  
Mahala, and Amanda, or the proceeds of its sale if  
they prefer disposing of it in that way for the sake of  
more equal division.

Brown 4<sup>o</sup>, I give and bequeath unto my Nephew A.  
R. Allmand, and Augustine Allmand, and my two  
Nieces Mahala Hudson and Amanda Wells the balance  
of my property consisting of Household and Kitchen  
furniture, Cattle, Horses, Sheep, Plantation tools, various  
household articles, or whatever else may belong to me at my dece-  
ase. And it is my will and desire that all the property  
named in this item, be sold at public sale, and the  
proceeds after paying my just debts, be equally di-  
vided between my Nephew A. R. Allmand, and Augustine and  
my Nieces Mahala and Amanda, Share and Share  
alike.

Georgia - Will of Octavious  
Fulton County 3<sup>rd</sup> September 1855  
Personally came into Court before Plaintiff  
and Thos M. Barnall, two of the subscribers  
witnesses to the last will and testament of W. H. Hockley  
deceased, which witness being duly sworn deponed  
and testified, that they saw the testator the testator  
Sign, Seal, publish, and declare, the instrument now  
presented as his last Will and testament, freely  
and voluntarily, out of his own accord, and without any  
compulsion or influence whatever, that at the time  
of the execution of said will said testator was of  
sound and disposing Mind and Memory, that  
deponents signed said will in the presence of
