Anderson District I William M Murtry being
of Sound and disposing Mind and Memory and being
to mind the Uncertainty of life and being desirous to
dispose of all such worldly estate as it be. I have
God to bless me with, do hereby declare my last Will
in the Manner following, that is to say I am desirous
that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid
after the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses
It is my desire that my wife Catharine M Murtry
have the remainder of my estate, both real and personal to
lifetime or widowhood

It is also my desire that my wife Catharine M Murtry
shall give to each of my children five dollars when
they arrive to twenty one years of age

It is also my desire that my wife Catharine M Murtry
shall have full power to sell at pleasure all the land that
I have lawfull title for at my death, and I hereby au-
thorise my wife Catharine M Murtry to make a deed
and convey all title to the purchaser of said land
And it is also my desire that she shall sell all my
part of my property at pleasure

It is my desire that she shall stand firm her life time or widow hood, and after death whatever is proper to she may have shall be equally divided among my children

But should my wife Catharine McMurtry marry again it is my desire that all the property both real and personal that she then has shall be sold publicly to the highest bidder on a credit of eight or ten or twelve months as the case may be. And the money collected and divided equally between my son James Addison and my daughter Rebecca Elizabeth, that is one third of the money shall be given to my wife Catharine McMurtry and the remainder shall be equally divided between my son James Addison and my daughter Rebecca Elizabeth
