God bless me with, do the following in my last will  
in the manner following that is to say, it is my desire  
that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid  
After the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses  
It is my desire that my wife Catharine H. Murphy  
have the remainder of my estate, goods, real and personal  
lifetime or widowhood.

It is also my desire that my wife Catharine H. Murphy  
I shall give to each of my children five dollars when  
they arrive to twenty one years of age  
It is also my desire that my wife Catharine H. Murphy  
shall have full power to sell at pleasure all the land the  
I have lawfully taken for at my death, and I hereby  
raise my wife Catharine H. Murphy to make and  
and cause to sell to the purchase of said land  
And it is also my desire that she shall sell a  
part of my property as pleased

It is my desire that the above shall stand firm her life  
time or widowhood, and after death whatever property  
by she may have shall be equally divided among my  
children.

But should my wife Catharine M<sup>c</sup>Murphy Marry again  
it is my desire that all the property both real and personal  
that she then has shall be sold publicly to the highest bid-  
der on a credit of eight or ten or twelve months as the case  
may be and the money collected and divided equally  
between my son James Addison and my daughter Rebecca  
Elizabeth, that is one third of the money shall be given  
to my wife Catharine McMurray and the remainder  
shall be equally divided between my son James Addison  
and my daughter Rebecca Elizabeth.
