part to be given to him when he becomes of age. The
wife holding her part until her death & then it to be
divided between said children

3rd

I desire my Executors to take charge of my place &
rent it out to the best advantage & the proceeds of the
same to be used for the support & education of said
children during their minority & that said place be free
from all incumbrances

4th

I desire that my executors improve the woodland to
the amount of a one horse farm & that to be on the south
east end of said lot

5th

I desire my executors that after setting apart a years
support for the widow & children that the balance of
the personal property be sold & used for the payment of
my debts &c

6th

I Marion Newsum do hereby constitute & appoint
David Denton & John Newsum my Executors to carry
out this my last will & testament & hereby acknowledge
the same in presence of This July the 6th 1881

Third - To my wife Francis Levy I give the plantation where I now

hundred and twenty five acres more or less subject

I may have on hand at my death - She to make the es-
timation & take any two that she wants - I give her also my
buggy, a two horse wagon, all of my house hold & kitchen
furniture, three cows and two sows & pigs to be selected
by her, one hundred & fifty bushels of corn, two thousand
bundles of fodder, plow gear, tools &c to run a two
farm and Four hundred Dollars in cash to be paid
her immediately after my death out of any amount
she may have.
