Thousand Dollars, to be paid to the said *Justices* and their successors in office, or assigns; for which payment, well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves jointly and severally, and each of our heirs, executors and administrators, firmly by these presents.

Sealed with our seals, and dated at *Brunswick* the *fourth* day of *August* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty *nine*

The Condition of the above Obligation is such, That if the above bounden

Geo. Harrington
Administrator of the goods, chattels and credits of *William Daley* deceased, do make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits, of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said *Geo. Harrington* or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons, for *him* and the same so made, do exhibit into the Court of Ordinary, when *he* shall be thereunto required; and such goods, chattels and credits, do well and truly administer according to law, and make a just and true account of *his* actings and doings therein, when required by the Superior Court, or Court of Ordinary for the County; and all the rest of the goods, chattels and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the account of the said administration, the same being first allowed by the said Court, shall deliver and pay to such persons respectively, as are entitled to the same by law: And if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the said deceased, and the same be proved before the Court, and the Executors obtain a certificate of the Probate thereof, and the said *Geo. Harrington* do in such case, if required, render and deliver up the said letters of administration, then this obligation to be void, else to remain in full force.
