and all my just debts paid out of my estate

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my son Charles G Bailey
one year support Bed and board and bed
equipments and my Rocking Chair and a certain
promissory note on Boon & Burdett amount Two
hundred and twelve dollars principal and interest
this amount of money is not to be use for him nor
by him until after he arrives to the age of
twenty one years unless his health becomes so
impaired as not to be able to make his support
by labour and then to be equally money expended
for his benefit

Item 3rd I Give and bequeath to Son A Henderson
my Milk Cow & Calf

Item 4th I give and bequeath all the remainder of estate
to be equally divided between Aquariah P
Bailey as one Legatee and the surviving Children
of Martha C Johnson daughter of A P Bailey
late deceased they making the other Legatee and
it is also my desire that my property be not
sold but divided by my Executor among the Legates
as before named

Item 574 I appoint ~~William S. Walker~~ Executor of this
 my last will and Testament having full faith
 and Confidence in his honesty and capability and
 I also appoint the said W. S. Walker the Guardian
 of my son Charles G. Bailey, to Control and manage
 estate
