Hunt of the town of Calhoun, in the County of Gordon, and State of Georgia, being of sound mind and memory, and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life, do therefore make, ordain, publish, and declare this to be my last Will and Testament: That is to say, first, after all my lawful and just debts are paid and discharged, the residue of my estate, real and personal, I give, bequeath, and dispose of as follows, (to wit) To my beloved son, James Johnson, the land and appurtenances, situated thereon, known and distinguished as the Jeff Fair lot, bounded as follows: on the East, by the street running from the Court House to Wm. H. Harris, on the West by the Western and Atlantic Railroad, on the South by Thomas A. Foster's. Said lot containing (2) Two acres more or less, Lying in the town of Calhoun, in the County of Gordon and State of Georgia, now possessed by me. Likewise I make, constitute, and appoint my said son Henry, to be my executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made.
