as far as a home for her as long as she remains a widow
free of bond and when her widowhood ceases by marriage
and she should continue to occupy said premises there
shall be a reasonable rent paid for the use of the same
and said rent to be equally divided between my two chil-
dren Parry Lee and Stephen Parry.

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife during her
natural life to dispose of at will one Coal ing stool with
squares the following Table and Table furniture six feet
bottom bottom book small chairs one Table chamber

one the Tools of my Trade Painting also one double Bassett
