 Lee Wills Daughter by a former Wife and Stephen
 Henry Wills son by my present Wife the House and Lot
 upon which I now live in the Town of Cassville Gordon
 County Georgia it being in the Land of Survey of said
 Town Lot and known and distinguished in said Survey
 of Lot 10 Survey nine 1877 I further desire give and bequeath
 to my beloved wife Maria H. Wills the above described premises
 as far as a home for her as long as she remains a widow
 free of rent and when her widowhood ceases by marriage
 and she should continue to occupy said Premises there
 shall be a reasonable rent paid further one of the same
 and said rent to be equally divided between my two Chil-
 dren Carrie Lee and Stephen Henry
 I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Maria during her
 natural life to dispose of at will one Coalmining Place and
 fixtures one folding Table and Table furniture six split
 bottom Chairs two small Chairs one Table Chair one
 large wash Pot Garden tools Consisting of Hoe Shovel and
 Plough Shovel Pick and also one large Wheelbarrow and
 one the Tools of my Trade Painting also one Double Barrel
 Shot Gun and one repeating Pistol and one Childs Cradle
 I give bequeath and devise to my Daughter Carrie Lee
 five hundred dollars to be paid out of my Personal Estate
 when collected the Balance amounting more to one six
 hundred dollars also to Carrie Lee the sum further her Mother
 and her share and the balance to the same person

for good & valuable furnished I wish to
 Comprehend Shirts, Pillows and Bolsters one
 large pine Chest two Trunks the one that I wear
 my and a small black Trunk also one black
 Sif Coin bottom Chairs and one large rocking
 Chair and a half interest in whatever may be drawn
 with the four tickets I have in the Calhoun Lottery
 I give and bequeath and desire to my son Stephen
 Henry one Bedstead feather bed & Mattress & the
 remaining half of the bed & clothes that are finished as is
 my silver Watch and Chain also a half interest in
 whatever may be drawn with the four tickets I have in
 the Calhoun Lottery and the remainder of my life
 Insurance Policy after paying Carrie L. her five hun-
 dred dollars is to be divided equally between my wife
 and son Stephen H.

I give and bequeath to my two Married daughters
 in addition to what I have already given them
 I give to each A Sibley and Sarah H. Sibley to each
 one dollar

I give and bequeath to my beloved Grand daughter
 Mary C. Sibley one large pine Chair one bedstead with
 one Bed and bedding belonging to the same and one
 Couch all of which are now in Albany Georgia

I hereby constitute and appoint my friend
 Zachariah T. Gray Executor of this my last will and
 Testament this the 27 day of October 1870
