Last Will of James Jennings

State of Georgia } In the name of God Amen.
 Gordon County } I, James Jennings, of said State and County, being of
 advanced age, but of sound and disposing mind and memory: knowing that I
 must shortly depart this life, I deem it right and proper, both as respects my
 family and myself, that I should make a disposition of the property, with
 which a kind Providence has blessed me. I do therefore make this my last
 Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others by me hereto-
 fore made.

First: That my body be buried in a decent manner, becoming
 my state in life, trusting that through the merits of my Lord and Savior
 Jesus Christ, my soul will return to God who gave it.

Second. I bequeath to my beloved wife Ellen Jennings my
 land and all my personal and perishable property, except my two Slaves,
 to have and use said land and personal property during her natural life.

Third. I bequeath by Daniel Hagan my two Slaves to her
 in fee simple, on condition, that in the said Daniel Hagan take care of
 and provide for my beloved wife Ellen Jennings during her natural life.

Fourth. I do hereby bequeath and transfer to and the quilts and
 sheets for one bed that are now in my possession are the property of my Grand
 daughter Maggie Jennings. I desire and direct that she the said Maggie
 Jennings is to have them whenever she needs them.

Fifth. On the death of my beloved wife Ellen Jennings, after
 she may have been decently buried and laid away, I do bequeath unto
 and direct that my land be equally divided between my Grand daughter
 Margaret Jennings and my daughter Mary Ann Hagan and my
 daughter, Bridget Vitcher and my daughter Ellen Bray. And I
 direct that my personal property, except our two Slaves which have
 already been bequeathed to Daniel Hagan on condition that he take care of
 my beloved wife, Ellen Jennings, and except our bed and bedding bequeathed
 to my Grand daughter Maggie Jennings, and except our bed and bedding to
 be given to my Grand daughter Ellen Hafford all remaining after the above
 exceptions to be equally divided between my Grand daughter Margaret
 Jennings and my daughter Mary Ann Hagan and my daughter Bridget
 Vitcher and my daughter Ellen Bray.

Sixth. I hereby appoint John H. Brumley as the Executor
 of this my last Will and Testament.

Seventh. I desire that this my last Will and Testament be
 executed without any expense in the Ordinary's office or elsewhere and that
 my wife Ellen Jennings be required to give no bond for the property

Gordon County, State of Georgia August 10th 1880

Last will of H. B. Hagan resident of said State and County

Item 1st Intending this to be a final disposition of my property Estate I hereby revoke all wills heretofore made by me

Item 2nd -- I give to my wife Mary A. Hagan my real and personal property of Land to wit in the 6th District and 3rd Section containing one hundred and sixty Acres also my live stock of Any kind two horse wagons and one buggy all the grain and crop on hand all the farming implements and all the household and kitchen furniture all the property I shall own at the time of my death for her sole and separate use with full power to sell or sell the same

Item 3rd -- I do hereby appoint my wife Mary A. Hagan Executor to this my will. -- In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 10th day of August 1880.
