I do therefore make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other testaments made by me.

1st Item. I will and bequeath to my beloved Wife Anna C. Moss all of my land including Lot No 311 of originally Cherokee word Gordon County and half of Lot No 250 word Gordon County to have and control during her natural life. And at her death I will and direct that said lands described above be divided between Longino R. Bailey Wife of A. P. Bailey my Daughter and my Son James C. Moss in the following manner Lot No 311 to be divided North and South, Longino R. Bailey to have the west half and James C. Moss the East half of said Lot of Land. The Fraction of No 250 to be divided East and West and my Daughter Longino R. Bailey to have the North half of said Fractional lots and James C. Moss the other half.

Item 2nd The residue of my effects whatever it may be I will and bequeath to my Wife Anna C. Moss.

3rd Item I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Robert H. Lashley Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
