make this my last Will and Testament  
hereby revoking and annulling all others  
by me heretofore made.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I desire and direct that my  
just debts be paid without delay, and  
there is no cause of delay.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give bequeath and devise  
to my beloved Wife Anna all my property  
both real and personal with all the  
rights incidents and appurtenances any  
wise belonging, during her Widowhood  
for the purpose of supporting maintaining  
and educating my children, and in the  
event she my beloved Wife Anna should  
die, then in that case I desire all  
my property both real and personal  
be sold and equally divided between  
my Wife Anna and children.
