State of Georgia } In the name of God, Amen.

Gordon County } I, John H. Armstrong of said State and County, being of advanced age, but of sound and disposing mind and memory; knowing that I must shortly depart this life, claim it right and proper both as respects my family and myself that I should make a disposition of the property which a kind Providence has blessed me. I do therefore make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore made.

First, I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it, as I hope for salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Secondly, I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executor herein after named and appointed.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Susan, for and during her natural life or widowhood for herself and my three beloved sons Paul, John and George, part of lot of land No 190 in 15th Dist. 8th Section being 135 acres more described in Deed from H. C. Cain to J. H. Armstrong. I desire that said land stand as for a home for my wife and these sons named above, and that it remain unsold until the youngest son becomes of age, and if Susan my wife is still living and a widow it remains unsold until her death, but if she be dead or married I desire and direct that said land be sold and divided equally between my three sons named above. I also desire and direct that my wife have our yearly support for herself and these sons out of my personal property. The property devised and bequeathed in the above article to my wife is in full extinguishment of her whole right to it over in my real estate, and personal property.

Fourth, The residue of my property, both real and personal, after my debts are paid otherwise and whatever it may be, I desire and direct to be taken charge of by my Executor and kept together and managed for the interest of my estate giving annually a support to all my single daughters under age, until Alice my youngest daughter becomes of age, then said property to be sold at the highest bidder and the proceeds divided equally between my beloved daughter Sallie Summerville, Loux Anna Addie Bell and Alice. My Executor is not forbidden but he is hereby instructed to sell enough of my property to pay all my just debts.

Fifthly, I hereby constitute and appoint my son-in-law John McMillan Executor of this my last Will and Testament. This 11th day of September 1879.
