State of Georgia

In the name of God Amen

I John Sloan being much afflicted in body lack of sound mind and discharging memory do make this my last Will and Testament, as God has blessed me with a portion of His wondrous goods. I desire to dispose of my effects in the following manner:

After my just debts are paid I desire my beloved wife Juliana to have control of my plantation during her natural life, for her subsistence, consisting of One hundred and sixty acres of land, being a part of Two lots, the East half of lot No 237 and East half of lot No 232, all being in the 13th Dist. and 3rd Sec.; and at the death of my wife, I will and bequeath to Three of my children, Jane and Malinda and Fielding, the East half of lot of land No 237, with all the improvements appertaining thereto, I will and bequeath to two of my sons, Felix and James, the East half of lot No 232, with all the improvements thereon, James to have Fifty Dollars the advantage in the value of said land.

I will and bequeath to my daughter Margaret a Fifty dollar Horse to be paid within twelve months after my death. I enjoin it on my three sons to furnish said Horse to Margaret to make her equal with my daughter Edelia who I have given a Fifty dollar Horse.

I appoint my sons Felix and Fielding as Executors of this my last Will and Testament, to execute as the law directs.
