Samuel and his wife Sophia and a boy Daniels to my
Son Thomas E. Dugan Monroe 4th I will and bequeath my
Slaves Mary Ann and William to my Daughter Amelia
Emeline Monroe 5th I will and bequeath to my Son John
E. D. Monroe and my Daughter Amelia Emeline Monroe
the lot of Land in 312 - 12 - 3rd Section of Gordon County
wherein I now live to be equally divided between them
when they shall come to the years of maturity to I will
to my wife Emily Monroe the use and Control of all
the value named Property during her widowhood or
minority of my two children by & My will is that all
my other children by my former wife viz James Monroe
William Monroe Martha Lipton Patrick Polly Hutchinson
Sarah and Hair be Paid by my Executor Five Dollars
each 8th I will and bequeath to my Son John Monroe the
sum of one hundred Dollars 9th I will give and bequeath
to my grand Sons Joseph Thomas Monroe and Monroe
Ashby Monroe the sum of Five Dollars each 10th I will that
my wife Emily Monroe be allowed to keep Possession of her
house two cows and calves and one yoke of Oxen and
Cattle and all my Stock & Crops 11th I will that my Slave
Kittie and his three children Josephine Hyd and Alfred
be sold by my Executor and that the Proceeds of the Sale
be applied to settling off the above bequest and the balance
be equally divided between my two grand Sons J. T. Monroe
and M. A. Monroe if they should apply for it and if my
Executor should judge it safe to pay it over either
Principle or interest discretionary with my Executor
judgment to apply and use it for my two minor children
Interest and raising and Education I do hereby appoint
my true and trusty friend Blair R. Mayd Lugo my
Executor to this my Last Will and Testaments fully
executing all others 13th all other Property to be sold and
