

Blessed Son and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my executors herein after named and appointed. Thirdly my will and desire is that all of my negroes (except Joy) be equally divided between my two sisters Margaret which Sarah Mother and the lawful heirs of Moses P. Wilson and Mary R. Wilson his wife. Fourthly my will and desire is that all the balance of my property be sold and distributed with the above named in the third article (equal). Fifthly My will and desire is that my negro man (Joe) shall have the right to choose his master to him with the said Negro Joe is not to be sold or conveyed any part of my estate. Sixthly I hereby constitute and appoint my friends William Mobley and Moses P. Wilson Executors of this my last will and Testament This December 27th 1864.
