Item 2 I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executor hereinafter appointed for there is need of delay as my debts are very small and few

Item 3 I give bequeath and devise to my beloved son son Henry D. Watts my tract of land wherein I now reside lie. Lots no (285) & (286) 24th Dist 2 Section Gordon County containing 300 acres with all legal rights members and appertinances in any manner appertaining to his own proper use and to his heirs assigns executors and administrators to them forever in fee simple I also give and bequeath in the same manner all of my stock of horses mules cattle hogs sheep and all my household and kitchen furniture and all my farming implements and ways re

Item 4 I am to have of my farm while I live a decent support and to be prudently used for in old age and infirmities.

Item 5 My poor former servant is to be taken care of while she remains in my place and when well

Item 6 I hereby constitute my beloved son Henry D. Watts Executor of this my last will and Testament, this May 30th 1871
