Item 3 I give bequeath and devise to my beloved son Tom Henry G. Walls my tract of land wherein I now reside lies Lots no 285 & (286) 24th Dist 2 Section Gordon County containing 300 acres with all tidal rights marshes and appertances in any manner appertaining to his own property and said to his heirs assigns executors and administrators to them forever in fee simple I also give and bequeath in the same manner all at my street at home miles cattle hogs sheep and all my household and kitchen furniture and all my farming implements and wagons &c

Item 4 I am to hand of my farm while in a decent support and to be prudently cared for in old age and infirmities.

Item 5 The farm former so named is to be taken care of while she remains on my place and others will

Item 6 I hereby constitute my beloved son Henry G. Walls my executor of this my last will and Testament this May 30th 1891
