State of Georgia } In the name of God Amen: I Morgan W. Sexton of the County
Gordon County } and State of aforesaid being weak in body but of sound disposing
mind and memory knowing that it is appointed to all men to die: I therefore do
make and obtain this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former
wills made by me.

In the first place I recommend my soul to God who gave it and
my body to be buried in a Christian-like manner.

And as touching the goods of this world, such as it hath pleased
God to bless me with, I will to be disposed of with in the following manner:

First, I will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid
out of my ready money and debts that is due to me, and should I fail to
have enough due me to satisfy or pay off my indebtedness I will that my
Executor sell at public or private sale perishable property or real estate
such as my wife may think she can spare best until enough is sold to raise
money to pay all my just debts.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife and faithful
companion Sarah C. Sexton all my real estate both real and personal that
may be left after my first request for the payment of my just debts. I give
her for her kindness to me and that she may be enabled to raise my dear
Hoping, my children. My real estate I give to my dear and beloved wife her
heirs and assigns for ever in fee simple.

Last of all, I appoint my beloved wife and faithful companion
Sarah C. Sexton Executrix to this my last Will and Testament.
