pigs two years and lambs and also I give and bequeath  
to her somethig near eighty acres of Land Commencing  
with the publick road and running a long back Road  
to the Hawker land and thence running a north course  
to a cross fence near the old barn and thence to have and  
to hold that parcel of land including the houses and im-  
provements on the same her life time or until her death  
marriage and to have two beds and two bedsteads and  
clothing for the same and her to have what will be remain-  
ing of the bed clothes also one clock and Cook Implement  
sets & farming tools as many as will be sufficient to  
carry on her Crofting and farming and one years  
provisions and one hogg and the Harness and one bee Stand

I Lem 4 I give and bequeath to Elijah Stance and his wife

Gentry Stance for my wife Elizabeth and her

child named William a boy named William

also one bedstead and bed and clothing for the same

I Lem 5 I give and bequeath to my son William a wife children  
one negro man named Will and one boy named William  
So the lots or one lot of Land to \$10 in the 26 District 3<sup>rd</sup> section  
of first heed up paying five hundred dollars for said  
lot then the land is to be theirs and also also to have one bed  
head and bed way house clothing also I give and bequeath to  
Son William A sum Two hundred dollars in money (I give  
that my negro boy off hand \$100 after the clear of the  
present her)

I Lem 6 I give and bequeath to my daughter Fatty Washington

four hundred Dollars in money

I Lem 7 I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Howard  
one negro girl named Emelie who is not to be sold out of  
the family and also Three hundred dollars in money

I Lem 8 I give and bequeath to my daughter Lavinia Henderson

Children One thousand dollars in money with interest on  
the money from my death

I Lem 9 I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Eastberry  
Children five hundred dollars in money

Item 10<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my son James Jackson  
children four dollars in Money

Item 11<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally Ann  
Bullock's children four hundred dollars to be  
divided between them

Item 12<sup>th</sup> I leave on the plantation one Negro girl named  
Moody until she is fifteen years old and after  
that she is to be sold for the benefit of the heirs

Item 13<sup>th</sup> I bequeath that my Son and he not sold until my  
wife dies or Marries

Item 14<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Atkins  
one hundred dollars in Money also Two hundred  
dollars to Elijah Standell in Money

Item 14<sup>th</sup> I hereby appoint Elijah Standell and my wife  
Elizabeth Atkins my lawful and trusty executors  
to carry my will into execution as directed in  
said will
