- Item 1st I desire that my body shall be buried in a
Christian like manner
- " 2nd To Marshall Volentine Coanaway I give and bequeath
my Clock
- " 3rd To Benjamin H Coanaway my son in Law and
Octavia Alexandra Walker my beloved daughter
who is now a single Woman I give bequeath
and devise all my Land and appertinances Situate
Thereon known and distinguished or described as the
Wells Walker farm Lot of Land one hundred
and sixty acres more or less No 160 14 District
3 Section lying in the County of Gordon and
State of Georgia together with all the residue

of my personal property to be equally divided
between the said Benjamin H. Conway,
and my daughter Octavia Alexander Walker
she and when alike upon the marriage
of the said Octavia.

- Item 4 If the said Octavia dies before marriage
and before the decease of the said Benjamin
H. Conway then I give bequeath and devise
said property to the said Benjamin H. Conway
- 5 If Octavia dies after the decease of the said
Benjamin H. Conway and without marriage
said property to my daughter the now present
wife of the said Benjamin H. Conway and
her children

Likewise I make constitute and appoint my
son in law Benjamin H. Conway to be
executor of my last will and Testament
hereby revoking all former wills made by me
In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed
my name and affixed my seal this the 22 day
of June 1868

kitchen furniture and as much of the personal prop-
erty as she may need during her widowhood the
remaining personal property to be sold

And should there be any improvement made on the
place such as building of a house or houses by any
of my family and by such improvement the plantation
be come more valuable I wish the person making
the improvement to have the benefit of that additional
value.

And I give to my wife again Murray
Thompson and in the event she shall have one third of the
plantation on which I now live during life

After the death of my wife I wish my land and other
property to be equally divided between my two chil-
dren George H. Thompson and Martha Jane Burns

I have given to my son George H. one hundred and
ten Dollars and I wish a similar sum of money to
be given to my daughter Martha J. Burns to be taken
out of the money collected that is now owing me
I wish the personal property sold which my wife
and children think she will not need but if they
think that it will be needed for the use of the place
then more is to be sold

If my children can not agree upon a division of the
land and other property then I wish the division made by
three disinterested men I do not wish my children to go
to law

I appoint my wife Charlotte C. Thompson and my
son George H. Thompson my Executors And for fear
that I have not sufficiently explained my wishes in the
foregoing I again repeat that it is my desire that my wife
