Considering the uncertainty of this frail and
transitory life do therefore make ordain publish
and declare this to be my last Will and Testament
That is to say.

First I want all my just debts paid, out of the
rents of the place and such property as can be
disposed with.

2nd I want my beloved wife Elizabeth A
Campbell to hold all my lands and stock
intact as they during her natural life or
widowhood and then divided as follows

3rd I want Sarah Jane Robertson and the heirs
of her body, Winnie Moland Campbell and the heirs
of her body if she should ever have any to have
the Home place, equally divided between them
by disinterested Arbitrators.

4th I want the place where Jim Woolen lives
divided equally between Lulu Woolen and
Lilly Mand Campbell and the heirs of there
body, the place so divided as to give each
a building place on the road, ^{or roads} and divided by
disinterested Arbitrators.

5th I want my place in the Valley, my old
place divided equally among the children share
and share about and then they can sell their
parts to each other as they think best.

If I should have any other property after my
debts are paid I want it divided or sold
and given to the children alike. Now dear
children I have done all I can for you. I hope
you will live in peace. Love your God and
pray that his Spirit may ever be with you
