Will of William Dillard.

In the name of God, Amen.

I William Dillard of said State and County being of advanced age but of sound mind and memory: knowing that I must shortly depart this life, deem it right and proper, both as respects my family and myself, that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed. I do therefore make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others, by me heretofore made.

First: I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian-like manner, suitable to my circumstances and conditions in life. My soul, I trust shall return to rest with God: who give it, as I hope for Salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Secondly: I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay, by my Executors, hereinafter named and appointed.

Thirdly:- I desire and direct and bequeath and give all of my lands to my six sons, to be equally divided.

Fourthly: I give and bequeath to my daughter Leicinda and her children www.georgiapioneers.com, including the account I or may have against them.

Fifthly:- I give and bequeath to my daughter Rodah and her children five hundred (\$500.) dollars, including the account I have or may have against them.

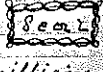
Sixthly:- I give and bequeath to my daughter Charlotte and her children five hundred (\$500.) dollars, including the accounts I have or may have against them.

Seventhly:- I give and bequeath to each of my daughters at the death of (myself and my wife) a bed and covering belonging to each.

Eighthly:- I desire and direct that all property I may have that is not mentioned in the above Will be equally divided among all of my children at the death of myself and wife.

Ninthly:- I hereby constitute and appoint my sons Wm. Dillard and M. M. Dillard Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

} Will of John Haynes.

} In the name of God. Amen; In the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy six, being in good health and sound in mind, do make the only written last Will and Testament.

1st I do will with and bequest to my beloved wife Ann M. Haynes, the land on which I live, containing eighty six acres more or less, it being a part of lot 287, 13th Dist. 3rd Section of said County, during her natural life, or widowhood.

2nd: I also will her all the household and kitchen furniture on the same terms as above.

3rd: Also, Horse and buggy, and stock of cattle and Hogs I also will to my four grandchildren they being the legal heirs of my daughter M. A. M. Hale, deceased, viz: John P. Hale, Sarah S. Hale, Emma Hale, Frank S. Hale and Porter Hale, each one Twenty Dollars, at the final distribution of my property. The balance of my property to be equally divided at the death of my wife Ann M. Haynes between the rest of my legal heirs, W. H. H. Haynes, John H. Haynes, and Virgil H. Haynes.

I also appoint W. H. Haynes John H. Haynes, and Virgil H. Haynes, Executors to my last Will and Testament.
