B. Jarrett of said state and county being of advanced
age and knowing that I must shortly depart this
life deem it right and proper both as respects my
family and myself that I should make a disposition
of my property, with which a kind Providence has
blessed me so therefore make this my last will and
testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made
by me.

I then I desire and direct that my body be buried
in a decent and christian like manner suitable to
my circumstances and condition in life my soul
I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it
as I hope for eternal salvation through the merits &
attainment of the blessed Lord and Savior Jesus Christ
& then I desire and direct that all my just debts
be paid

I then I give bequeath and devise to my son F S
Jarrett and my Daughter Sarah E Jarrett jointly
Lot of Land number two hundred and seventy (27)
or the twenty fourth (24) district and second section (2)
Gordon County containing one hundred and sixty acres
(160) according to survey the said lot being the home
stead or place in which we now all reside with
all the rights members and privileges to said lot of
land in anywise appertaining or belonging forever
Except one acre off said lot No two hundred and
seventy in the twenty fourth district and second
section (2nd) Gordon County on the east line of said
lot on which the school house and the Liberty Church
now stand the said one acre having been deeded
to the Trustees of said Church by me

I then I give bequeath and devise to my daughter
Julia A Adams, my son Nathan R Jarrett and
my son W. W. Jarrett children jointly lot of land
number one hundred and ninety nine (199) in the
seventh (7) district and third section Gordon County

containing one hundred and sixty acres according to
survey with all the rights members and privileges
to said lot of land in anywise appertaining or
belonging forever

I then I desire that whatever personal property I may
be possessed of at death to be sold and after paying all
my just debts the proceeds be equally divided with all
my children this February 29th 1876

Whereas I William B Jarrett did on the Twenty ninth day of February in the Year of our Lord Eight hundred and seventy six sign seal declare and publish my last will and testament in the presence of John McSmith Jasper Ashworth James A L Cousin and Isaac E Hofferd who signed the said Will and Testament as witnesses, And whereas I am desirous of altering and changing a bequest devise in the fifth article of said Will and to supply an omission or to change said article I therefore make and publish this Decree to said Will and testament.

First, I revoke and annul the said fifth article of said Will so far as relates to my personal property. Secondly, I give and bequeath to my son and daughter William S Jarrett and Sarah E Jarrett all the personal property I may possess at my death after paying expenses of last sickness and burial expenses. I hold me harmless from and discharged of all claims and demands to be made or applied to my last sickness and burial expenses and fixing my grave with Tomb stones and other things necessary this August 2nd day 1879.
