And first I commit my soul to God who gave it and my body I desire to be buried in the family burying-ground in the Pleasant Hill Burial ground in Gordon County, Georgia, and my worldly estate I dispose of as follows:

First

It do will, to my loving Wife Nancy L. Taylor during her life or widowhood the following named property viz. Lot of Land No 167, one hundred and sixty seven containing, 160 acres more or less in seventh district third section of originally Cherokee survey, now Gordon County the Lot of Land where upon my dwelling now stands and Lot number 184, one hundred and ninety four containing one hundred and sixty acres more or less and eighty five acres of Lot number two hundred and those all being north side of Lot, all of same District section and County aforesaid which constitute my home farm and place to have and to hold

for the benefit of herself and Children under
her contrall and if any to spare over a home
figue support if she sees proper, she can sell
it and divide it equally with our children untill
her death then after her death I want my chil-
dren if they can to divide said farm & homestead
allotted to their mother during her life equally
between each other if they can by cutting up
and buying each others interest in said premise

that I have gave her now in my possession
also I want my daughter Belia to have a cow
and bed when she marries as all the rest of the
Children have had one given them, and the
remainder of my House hold and Kitchen furni-
ture to be kept by my wife and to dispose of
as she thinks proper.

Third. I will that my Executor to sell the following
property to wit One House & Lot in Calhoun
Gordon County Georgia known as the Duffly House
and Lot on the opposite side of street from J. C.
Fair's Residence, a little south west and due
east of the Academy also one Lot of land No
163, One hundred and sixty three in 7th seventh
District and 3rd Third Section original survey
now in Gordon County containing one hun-
dred and sixty acres more or less, and a young
sorel mud now on farm all sold for

purpose of settling my just debts and distributing equal between my aforesaid Loving children all other property belonging to me not herein mentioned to be left in the care of my loving wife for the use of her and her family and after the death of my wife should there be any property not here mentioned left or in fact all she has left at her death then let my children divide it equal if they can, otherwise I will that my Executor or to the highest bidder and divide equal between my children whose names are all in this will -

Fourth: I will that Eliza my daughter now in her eighteenth year of age be her own Guardian to receive any money or property she may receive of my wife or Executor they may pay her, and her receipt be valid in law.

Fifth: And if at any time my loving wife should see fit to marry again, I will that she be entitled to child's part of my estate, which would become necessary at her marriage to be made and make an equal division as aforesaid.

Sixth: I will that my son Samuel R. Taylor be my Executor to carry out my aforesaid will. In witness whereof I the said William G. Taylor do set my hand and seal this 11th day of October 1887.
