In the name of God Amen:
I Zachariah S. Black of said State
and County, being of very feeble health, but of sound
mind, disposing mind and memory; feeling that I may shortly
depart this life, deem it right and proper that I should
make a disposition of the property with which a kind
Providence has blessed me I do therefore make this my
last will and Testament revoking and annulling all
others by me heretofore made -

First: That my body be buried in a decent manner
becoming my estate in life trusting that through the
merits of my Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ my soul
will return to God who gave it.

Second: That all my just debts be paid out of the
proceeds of my estate.

Third: I bequeath to my beloved Brother, John S. Black
my King farm to wit, lot of land No 39 and 120 Acres
off of No 22-15 Dist and 3rd Section Gordon County Ga
Subject to the provision in the next paragraph

Fourth: Believing that my King farm is worth three
hundred dollars more than my home farm, I direct
that John S. Black pay to my beloved Cousin Mary B.
further the interest on three hundred dollars as long
as she remains single and on her marriage to pay
her the principal three hundred dollars.

Fifth: I bequeath to my beloved Sister Mariash C.
Boswell and her heirs my home farm to wit

141 acres of No 4 and 120 acres of No 5 and 33 acres of No 6 all in 15th Dist and 3rd Sections -

Sixth: I direct that all of my perishable property not needed to run the two farms, be sold and proceeds be applied to the payment of my debts; any of the perishable over enough to pay my debt, be divided equally between my Brother John Black and my Sister Mariah E. Baswell.

Seventh: I direct that my beloved Mother Anne Guber and her Husband Williamson Guber be supported during their natural lives and my Cousin Mary E. Guber is to be supported so long as she remains with the family. The expenses of this paragraph to be born equally by John S. Black and Mariah E. Baswell, in consideration of the fact that they have the two farms aforesaid. I include in the support of my Mother the expenses attending her last illness and a decent Burial; but do not include the expenses of last illness and burial of Williamson Guber.

Eighth: I hereby appoint John S. Black as the executor of this my last Will and Testament this Second day of October in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred and Eighty four
