To my Sister Sarah Cook I give & bequeath a negro girl by the name of Hannah & the remainder part of my property to be sold (and) after paying my just debts equally divided between Brother Ezekiel Perkins Brother William Perkins Alexander Robinson & his heirs (and) Sister Sarah Cook & I have my Brother William Perkins my Executor to act on this my last will & testament given under my hand & seal this 25th day of March 1819
