 Georgia do make and ordain this my last Will and testament

1st It is my wish that all my just debts should be paid

2nd I will and bequeath to my son William Corry all that lot or parcel
 of Land containing One hundred and twenty eight acres lying on the North side of
 the tract of Land whereon I now live

3rd I will and bequeath to my son John Corry the tract of Land whereon I
 now live together with all the appurtenances relative to the same and further it is
 my wish for said John Corry to take particular care and attention of his mother and
 sister Jane Corry so long as he or they shall live and it is further my desire that
 my son John Corry should have my desk

4th It is my Will and desire that after the death of my beloved wife Jane Corry
 that all the perishable property be Equally divided between all my Children all
 of which I do hereby acknowledge to be my last Will and testament wherein
 I have set my hand and seal this fourteenth day of October One thousand eight
 hundred and sixteen
