In the name of God Amen I Amy Stringfellow of the State of Georgia being afflicted in my body but of sound mind & memory & knowing the uncertainty of life & the certainty of death, do wish my property disposed of in the following manner.

Item First It is my wish that all my just debts be paid out of the sale of my property.

Item second I wish & bequeath to Elizabeth Stringfellow widow of Benjamin Stringfellow one cart & one large iron Kettle.

Item third I wish & bequeath to my Grand daughter Sarah Stringfellow daughter of Benjamin Stringfellow one clock & one large fine Chest & one hundred Dollars also one half the interest which I have or may have in the Contemplated Land Lottery.

Item fourth I wish & bequeath unto my Grand son George Stringfellow son of Robert Stringfellow thirty Dollars not to be paid him till he attains the age of twenty one years.

Item fifth I wish the balance of my property to be equally divided between my Children.

Item sixth I wish & appoint my beloved friend Elizabeth Stearns my Executor to this my last Will & Testament revoking all previous Wills or Wills by me made. In Witness

In the name of God Amen I Ephekeel O Parks of Greene County in the State of Georgia being in a low and infirm state of body and of sound (and) disposing mind (and) memory (and) understanding considering the uncertainty of death, and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs, and thereby for the better prepared to leave the world, return at shall please God to call me hence do therefore make (and) publish this my last will & Testament in manner (and) form following that is to say First All is my will and desire that all my just be paid as soon as my Executors herein after named can conveniently do so, (and) for the better enabling them to meet the demands against my Estate, I do hereby authorize (and) empower them to sell or manage my Estate either real or personal or both (and) as they may deem most beneficial to my Estate and they are hereby authorized to sell the ^{whole} or any part thereof (and) make (and) execute bills for the same in full (and) ample a manner as they may see fit, and do the same myself if the proceeds thereof to be applied to discharge of my just debts and (and) as soon as my said Executors shall have (and) sufficient of my Estate to pay the same
