My will is that all my property real and personal be equally divided among my seven Children to wit William Baker Jonathan Baker Silas Baker Nancy Lafferty Mary Eliza and Elizabeth Baker I also appoint my son Jonathan Baker and John my lawful Executors in Writing whereof I have set my hand and Seal this twenty first of February One thousand Eight hundred and twenty one

It is my will and desire that all the property or effects of which I disposed, or to shall remain in the hands of my Executors hereafter named for and during the space of five years from my decease; which said Executors are hereby authorized and required to pay over to my daughter Mary Ross annually the <sup>interest or</sup> proceeds thereof for and during that time should she so long live. But should she become a widow at that time, it is then my desire that my Executors deliver immediately the whole of my Estate into her hands, or should she die let it be delivered in like manner to such child or children as she may leave. But should she have no children or children then my said Estate go to the grand Children of my sister Agnes Wallace formerly Agnes Aiken. But in the event of my said daughter not so becoming a widow it is my desire that my Executors deliver over my said Estate to her immediately on the expiration of the time aforesaid; or to such child or children as she may be leave. But should she die without legitimate child or children, then it is my desire that my said Estate go to and become the property of the said grand child or grand children of my said sister. Item 1<sup>st</sup> It is my will (and) desire that my Creditors hereafter named shall pay all my just debts out of such funds of mine as they may have in their hands or by the sale of such property as they in the exercise of their best judgment or discretion may think proper to sell so as to promote my objects herein expressed (and) the best interest of those immediately concerned Keeping in view as far as practicable, a sacred regard to such specific legacies as may herein after Contained

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I do hereby give (and) bequeath unto my nephew James Robinson his heirs (and) assigns forever (he being the son of my Mother Ephrosdatus Robinson) a certain negro woman named Sophia or Sophy with her future increase but in case my said nephew James Robinson should <sup>die</sup> before he arrives to the lawful age of Twentyone years, then and in that case it is my will and desire that (said) negro woman Sophia or Sophy (and) her increase shall descend to my Mother Joseph Robinson of (now) deceased South Carolina (and) his heirs male if my said nephew James Robinson should marry and have lawful issue therefrom in which event (said) negro and her increase shall go to his lawful issue. It is further my will and desire that my Executors shall during the minority of my (said) nephew James Robinson act as Guardians or Trustees for him in the management of the (said) Sophia or Sophy with her increase for his use and benefit.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I do hereby give and bequeath unto my (said) Mother Joseph Robinson the residue of my property both real (and) personal debts due or demands after the satisfaction of my debts aforesaid and the specific legacies heretofore pointed out.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my worthy friends Thomas Sasser Junr (and) Daniel Sanford of (said) State and County my Executors to this my last will and Testament, (and) Trustees for carrying the same into effect full effect Given under my hand and seal this Second day of October 1821
