A Codicil to the Will of Charity Dugayt this day annexed to her original  
will previously executed and witnessed.

Whereas by the laws of the State of Georgia it is impracticable for any by  
will or otherwise to emancipate a certain negro woman named Phellis, and inasmuch  
as I am desirous of rewarding the ~~day~~ Phellis for her faithfulness, I do hereby appoint my  
friends Thomas M. Sprague and James H. Nickelson trustees for and in behalf of said woman  
Phellis and as her Trustees or Guardians. I do hereby vest in them the right and title to said  
negro woman Phellis requesting ~~and~~ desiring them to exercise the right of ownership over  
her so far as is practicable defend her from all unlawful acts or trespasses committed on  
her by other persons but giving
