I shelly now here.

After the payment of my debt, I hereby give and bequeath to William S. Paulson, attorney at law, of any kind and description, to him & his heirs.

It is further my Will and desire, that my Negro Woman Sally, be permitted to remain about the House, to manage the Care of the Young Children, & that she should at no time be put in the field, to labour, or be exposed to what my Parents, if the Legislature will do its purpose her freedom.

I hereby constitute and appoint Standard
Paythorp, & Louisa Weller, my true lawful Executors to carry
this will into effect.
