

Clayborn Andersons Will

Georgia Greene County

In the name of God Amen. I Clayborn Anderson of the State of Georgia aforesaid being afflicted in my body but of sound mind and memory and knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death I wish my property disposed of in the following manner

Item 1st It is my will that all my just debts be paid out of the debt due on which the mortgage collecter I have secured I will ever bequeath to my mother Sarah Patton All the money notes and accounts which may be due me at my death after my debts is paid

Item 2nd I will and bequeath to my sister Polly Wilson this judgment I have on her husband John Wilson Jr of the said John Wilson will pay the cost of suit & Adams & Dafford for getting said judgment which is now due and

Item 3rd I will and bequeath to my brother Alfred E. Anderson my estate

Item 4th I appoint James H. Garrett my Executor to this my last Will and Testament and keep all previous Will or Wills by me made In WITNESS whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 25th December 1827

John Garratts Will

In the name of God Amen. I John Garratt Farmer of the State of Georgia and County of Greene being of sound mind & memory but recollecting the certainty of death do make and ordain this my last will and Testament. It is my will and desire that my body be buried in a decent & Christian like manner and as respects such worldly Estate as it has pleased God to bless me with in this life I desire to dispose of the same in the following manner form (1827)

Item 1st It is my will & desire my just debts and funeral expenses be paid

Item 2nd It is my will and desire and I do will (and bequeath unto my three grand children of the B Garratt (1827) Martha C Garratt John A Garratt & Anne M Garratt the following negroes namely Sally a woman and Liddy a girl Neek a boy Pelle a fellow (and increase but for the use of Thomas B Garratt my son during his natural life

Item 3rd It is my will & desire and I do hereby give and bequeath to my Executors hereafter to be named three negroes namely Patsy a woman Rachel a boy Richard a boy all to be applied to (and for the use of Elizabeth W Jackson her lifetime and after her death to her legal children if any in fee simple be it in case of no child or children legal heirs then to be paid to my or my executors named the three negroes (viz) Patsy Rachel & Richard with increase to be paid to my or my executors named all my children or their legal representatives who are and be shall be heirs
