

6 Muldox's Will

George Muldox In the name of God Amen

I being hereby seized & possessed of the County of Wake aforesaid being well in body but of perfect sound mind memory do make & declare this my last will & testament I recommend my soul to God who gave it me & my body to be decently buried My worldly possessions of in the following manner viz

- 1 To my son William I Muldox I his heirs I give I bequeath the tract of land on which I now live known by the name of the Nationall Ford containing by estimation two hundred acres including the Grist mill with all other improvements thereon except one half of the same mill & that part thereof to which Edward White is entitled while the present frame or woodwork stands I also give to my said son my negro man Ned the blacksmith with all my blacksmiths tools & my iron & my carriage my new side board & bedstead bed & furniture my watch & all my wearing apparel in addition to the property heretofore given him
- 2 To my daughter Anna White I her heirs I give I bequeath two negroes viz Henry & Isaborn one bedstead & bed & furniture in addition to the property I have heretofore given
- 3 To my daughter Betsy Barry I her heirs I give I bequeath four negroes viz Reuben & Sam & her two children Olivia & Hesterella one bedstead & bed & furniture in addition to what I have heretofore given her
- 4 To my daughter Susannah White I her heirs I give I bequeath one negro man named Reuben & six hundred & fifty dollars one bedstead & bed & furniture in addition to what I have heretofore given her
- 5 To my daughter Betsy Gibbs I lend for & deliver her maintenance till the six negroes following viz Major & Betty & her four children Ned & Mercison & Harriet & Lurania & after her death said negroes with their increase is descend to her heirs forever To my daughter Betsy Gibbs I her heirs I give I bequeath six hundred & fifty dollars in cash or notes or in real estate & bed & furniture
- 6 To David Ellington I give I bequeath a negro woman named Uring being one I received by my intermarriage with his mother also one infant child of said Uring not yet named
- 7 To Isaac Ellington I give I bequeath a negro man named Abraham being one I received by my intermarriage with his mother should Isaac & David Ellington or either of them lose the negroes devised to them by any claim or title other than that I have my estate is not to repair any such loss
- 8 To William W D Weaver I give I bequeath a negro man named Uring being a negro which fell to me on the division of the estate of Benjamin Weaver dec also one bed & furniture which he has in his possession one high bureau six silver tea spoons some set & china on his premises my executors the amount which he owes me by note & on open account
- 9 To Francis Weaver I give I bequeath a negro boy name Albert and an old negro woman named Rebecca or Betty the boy Albert being one which

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fell to me in the division of the estate of Benjamin Weaver deceased. I have
suggested an exchange with the said Lewis for the the said Lewis. I have
Dolly who fell to the said Lewis in the division of his father's estate. I
also give him one feather bed & furniture on board which is in his
house one pair of brass Andirons & six silver table spoons the land which
fell to me in the division of the Weaver estate. I give to the said William or
Lewis to be equally divided between them. I also give him six Windsor
chairs which I received from the estate of Benjamin Weaver deceased

10th The balance of my estate land, situated to be three hundred & sixty acres
adjoining the tract on which I live. I give & bequeath to my three daughters
Anna White, Susannah White & Patience Gibbs & their heirs to be equally divided
between them having due regard to quantity & quality with this reservation, have
that my son Anthony is to have the privilege of taking & take timber for
any part of said land for the use of the saw mill without any hindrance from
the devisees under this section.

11 Over & above the bed furniture already bequeathed I have a number of coun-
terpane sheets 16 on which the names of my children or the persons for whom
were intended are marked; these I wish my executors to deliver to the persons
whose names are marked thereon.

12 Over & above the bed my stock of all the items planted on Allen's wagon road
Giggs carries all my household kitchen furniture. All my property of every description
not herein bequeathed I wish to be sold by my executors on such time & terms as my
executors may think proper & the proceeds of such sale together with the notes &
accounts & cash on hand at my death to be equally divided among the whole of my
children or Anthony & Frederick Anna White, Susannah White, Patience Gibbs
& Patience Gibbs share & share alike & paid over to them respectively in notes or money
as my executors may choose

13 My executors are hereby vested with full power to advertise such real & personal
property as is subject to be sold under this will for such a length of time, either
as they may think proper sell on such terms as they may deem most proper
advantageous to my estate without being bound by the laws governing executors &
administrators sales. It is also my will that my property be appraised but such part as is
directed to be sold

14 Should a devise under this will be disqualified with or make any objection to such
lot or portions as is devised to him or her whether of negroes beds or any
other thing bequeathed my executors may have such lot or property sold on such
time & terms as they may think proper & pay over to such disqualified devisee the
proceeds of such sale in notes or money

Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute, appoint Charles D. Stewart, Elton
Torrence executors of this my last will & testament hereby revoking & disannulling
any former will. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed
my seal this 7th day of November 1822 after interlocking the records not herein begun

 wherein I now live during her widow hood & at her intermarriage to
 be sold & the money there arising to be equally divided among the said
 Elizabeth Muller Jane Muller Alinda Muller Green Muller the heirs of David
 Muller the bodily heirs of Nelly & the present heirs of Pijack Muller
 Meliah Muller Elijah Muller John B. Muller Urgan Muller Martha Ann
 Muller & Simon Muller & the said Elizabeth Muller should die before in-
 termarriage then & in that case the said Land to be sold & the money there
 arising to be equally divided among the rest of the above named heirs. I give and
 bequeath to my daughter Polly Durick the sum of one dollar to be paid out
 my estate. I give & bequeath to my sons Alfred & Green Muller the sum of one
 hundred & three dollars each to be paid out my estate. I give & bequeath to
 the heirs of David Muller the sum of one hundred dollars to be paid out of
 my estate. I give & bequeath to the present heirs of Nelly Muller the sum of
 eighty dollars. I give & bequeath to the bodily heirs of Nelly & the sum
 of eighty dollars. I give & bequeath to Meliah Muller the sum of one hundred
 & fifteen dollars. I give & bequeath to Urgan Muller John B. Muller Eliza
 Muller Martha Ann Muller & Simon Muller the sum of one hundred &
 fifteen dollars. I give & bequeath to my daughter Nelly Muller the sum of
 one hundred & fifteen dollars. I give & bequeath to my daughter Nelly
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
