

In the Name of God Amen I David Sherrill of the County of Greene and State of Georgia being weaking bodily but of sound mind and memory, Knowing that it is appointed for me to die do ordain this my last Will and Testament first of all I command and testify to God who gave it and my friends to the Earth to be buried in a decent & Christianlike manner at the discretion of my friends as touching such worldly goods as it shall please you to give I bequeath in the following manner viz
 I leave (and) bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Sarah Watts a certain negro woman named Rachel a child named Stephen also a tract of Land containing one hundred and sixteen acres One horse saddle (and) bridle one Cow (and) Calf one Bed Furniture I also leave (and) bequeath to my beloved daughter Elizabeth Tooker one hundred and twenty acres of land wherein she now lives also two negro girls named Cynthia (and) Sarah one horse (and) saddle one Cow (and) Calf one bed (and) furniture
 I also leave (and) bequeath to my beloved daughter Mary Broach Two negro girls named Melly (and) Lucy also one horse (and) saddle One Cow & Calf one Bed (and) furniture
 I also leave (and) bequeath to my beloved Daughter Parshaanna Alford two negro girls named Harriet (and) Lazarus also one horse (and) saddle one Cow (and) Calf one bed Furniture
 I also leave (and) bequeath to my beloved son Wilson one negro boy named Tom and one girl named Eliza One horse (and) saddle one Cow and Calf one Bed and furniture
 I also leave (and) bequeath unto my beloved son David one negro boy named Anthony one girl named Lydia one horse saddle (and) bridle one Cow & Calf one bed and furniture
 I also leave (and) bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Lavinia one negro boy named Abraham One woman named Patience (and) Child named Mary One horse saddle one Cow & Calf one bed Furniture
 I also leave (and) bequeath unto my beloved son Berry one negro boy named Jack one girl named Lydia one horse Saddle Horseshoe one Cow & Calf one bed Furniture
 Also leave (and) bequeath unto my beloved son William three negroes a boy named Peter two girls Grace (and) Linda one horse & saddle One Cow & Calf one Bed (and) furniture
 I also leave (and) bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth six negroes my Samson Jack Harry Phoebe Lucy and Crease during her natural life with the use of the plantation wheron she now lives with the stock plantation utensils house tools & Kitchen furniture at her death all my (Land) with the premises where I now live is to be equally divided between my three sons David, Berry & William also the six negroes Samson, Jack, Harry, Phoebe, Lucy & Crease but (and) that out of the amount of sale that my daughter Elizabeth Tooker receive one hundred and thirteen Dollars my Daughter Rebecah Boon receive four hundred and twenty three Dollars (and) that my Daughter Mary Broach receive five hundred and twenty three Dollars and that my Daughter Parshaanna Alford receive four hundred and twenty three Dollars Also my son Wilson receive Forty Eight Dollars Also my son David receive One hundred and eighteen Dollars My daughter Lavinia receive Eighteen Dollars Also my son Berry receive four hundred and eight twenty three Dollars my son William receive two hundred and twenty three Dollars & the balance of the amount of sale of (our) negroes together with all the stock plantation tools household (and) Kitchen furniture to equally divided between my two Children Sarah Watts Rebecah Boon Mary Broach Parshaanna Alford Wilson Sherrill David Sherrill Lavinia Sherrill Berry Sherrill & William Sherrill I also leave (and) bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Rebecah Boon one negro boy named Tom one horse and saddle one Cow & Calf one bed Furniture
 I also leave (and) bequeath to my son Berry & William a negro girl named

Chancing to be equally divided between them I do also appoint David & William
Worrell and William Clegg my lawful executors to this my last Will and Testament

sense (and) memory do make this my last will (and) Testament and as to my worldly goods
which it hath been please God to give me I give & dispose of as follows
and I give (and) bequeath to my son John Shartee one dollar to him and his heirs forever
and I give (and) bequeath to my daughter Susannah Shartee one Dollar to her and her heirs forever
and I give (and) bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Sawyer one Dollar to her and her heirs forever
and I give (and) bequeath to my daughter Anna Richards one Dollar to her and her heirs forever
and I give (and) bequeath to my son also Shartee my hole Stock (and) Cattell (and) all my
flock (and) feathered & furnished (and) Stock of Cattle all my Stock of hogs all my
household and Kitchen furniture of all Kinds whatever (and) all the balance of my Estate
whatever to him (and) his heirs forever I do also constitute (and) appoint my son also
Shartee my hole sole Executor of this my last Will (and) Testament (and) I do hereby
disallow (and) revoke all (and) every other former Testaments wills or legacies bequeath'd & ratifying
(and) Confirming this (and) other to be my last will (and) Testament in Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand (and) seal the day & year above written
