Georgia. } April the fifteenth day in the Year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight In the name of
God Amen.
I Edwin T. Walker of the county and State above mentioned
being very sick and feeble of Body but of sound mind and memory
do constitute and make this my Last Will and Testament first
of all I commend my spirit to that God who gave it, and my
Body to its mother Earth, which I wish to be decently buried, and
a Tombstone procured by my Executor and laid over me, with an Epitaph
of my Name & age, and as respects my earthly goods and chattels
First of all I wish all of my Just debts paid -
Secondly -
I give and bequeath to my beloved Father Matthew Walker my
Negroes namely Mariah, Joe, and Charity.
Thirdly,
I give and bequeath to my Brother Samuel my Horse, Saddle
Bridle and Watch.
Fourthly
I give and bequeath to my Sister Martha W. Walker one
Thousand dollars to be paid to her by my Executor to do with
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as collected and payable, the due without a lawful heir
of his body, the said one thousand dollars then to mature
to my Father's Estate, which I give to him to dispose off as
he may think proper.

Fifthly,

I give to my sisters Jane Hutchinson and Nancy Brooks
each one hundred dollars for their own individual
benefit to be paid to them by my Executor as they may
wish it. The Balance of my Estate I give to my Brother
William B. Walker and sisters Amanda Ann and
Louisa to be equally divided between them and after
giving my Brother William B. his part I wish the balance
kept in one common stock until my sister Amanda becomes
of age at which time I wish a division giving her her
part and then keeping the balance in one common
stock until sister Ann becomes of age at which time
I wish an equal division between her and my sister
Louisa and should either of them die before they
become of age the surviving one of the Three to
have their part and that be kept in one common
stock, my Father Matthew Walker, I constitute and
appoint my Executor.
