2nd I give I bequeath to my loving wife Elizabeth Fuller the tract of land
whereon I now live during her widow hood. For her intermarriage to
be sold & the money there arising to be equally divided among the said
Elizabeth Fuller Lett Fuller Alinda Fuller Green Fuller the heirs of David
Fuller the bodily wife of Miller. Next the present heirs of Phile Fuller
Melah Fuller Elijah Fuller John B. Fuller Ciza Fuller Martha Ann
Fuller & Simon Fuller. If the said Elizabeth Fuller should die before in-
termarriage then her that care the said Land to be sold & the money there
arising to be equally divided among the rest of the above named heirs. I give and
