

Amount of One hundred & Eighty Dollars, and leaving given her only about Fifty Dollars I request & desire that my Executors pay to her one hundred & forty Dollars for the purpose of placing her on an Equality with the rest of my Children. My will therefore that the residue be divided into two equal parts, but moreover as I have been compelled to pay one hundred Dollars for my son James Woodham in addition to the property which other previously gave him I wish that sum deducted from his share (and) divided equally among the other two parts with this deduction his part is to be paid to him and an equal seventh part with its proportionate part of the said one hundred Dollars is to be paid to each of my other sons Edward & Garrett and to my daughter Polly Ann Hightower Sophia Bell & Melinda Woodham.

The other seventh part I give (and) bequeath to my daughter Anna Daniel & her children as she may have living at the time of their death, but the same is to remain in the hands of my qualified Executor or Executrix as Trustee for said Anna Daniel & her Children as the men has no wife therefore have and said Trustee are hereby directed to make such payments (and) appropriations of the part of my Estate so as has aforesaid directed as may in their discretion appear most for the benefit of my said daughter and children if it should any of my said Children die before myself then my will is that the part or share of my Estate to which such child would be entitled shall not (and) be paid to their children equally; but should any of my children die without children living at the time of their death then their parts shall be divided among my surviving Children.

I do hereby appoint my son Edward Woodham and my friend George W. Foster Executors of this my last Will (and) Testament. In testimony of all which I have hereunto set my hand this

George Greene County, On the name of God ame. I Elizabeth Brown of the County of Greene being sound in mind & memory do make Constitute & ordain this my last will & Testament to wit Item 1st I give and devise to my daughter Elizabeth Hale one negro boy called John Jones to her and her heirs forever.

Item 2^d I give (and) devise to my daughter Polly Hale one negro named Isaac to her heirs forever I long 3rd I give and devise to my daughter Nancy P. Brown one negro woman Amy, & an Heather bed & furniture called hers on her said daughter paying me £27. Thirty Dollars for the bed furniture all of which I give to her there heirs forever.

Item 4^t I give & devise to my daughter Nancy P. Brown one negro woman Lucy there future increases also one feather bed and furniture called hers on her pay Thirty Dollars to my Exec

such property I give to her & her heirs forever.
Item 5th I give and devise to my two sons Ezekiel Brown & Ruben Brown to be equally divided between Ruben & Brown may come of age or marry one negro woman Lucy and her future increase also one negro boy Ned to them and their heirs forever. I also give my two sons one good feather bed & furniture each to be given them at the time of my death. I also give to my two sons all my interest little claim I have to my Father's Estate that my mother now has a life Estate in. I also give my son Ruben Brown the Grandchildren his Father's Estate.

Item 6th I give ~~my~~ devise to my Grandson Ruben Brown Five Dollars to him to his heirs forever.

Item 7th My Will & devise further is that my Es^t reserves a sufficient support for any four Children now living with me for the next namely Ezekiel Brown Nancy O'Brien Thresh Brown & Ruben Brown the quantity of provisions to be adjudged by any two or more good Citizans.

Item 8th The balance of my property as well as the Sixty Dollar to be paid by my two daughters Nancy & Phoebe to my Executors Sarah appropriated to the payment of my debts the remainder if any (the property having been first paid on a credit of twelve months) my wife and devise to be equally divided between all my Children both married & single.

Lastly I constitute & appoint my son Ezekiel Brown Executor to my last will & Testament In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this tenth day of Sept^r in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred & twenty six
