Green County 3 In the name of God Amen I Amy Stringfellow of the State & County aforesaid being afflicted wth bodily infirmities & memory & knowing the uncertainty of life & the certainty of death, do make my property disposed of in the following manner.

Item first It is my will that all my just debts be paid out of the sales of any property.

Item second of late I bequeath to Elizabeth Stringfellow widow of Benjamin Stringfellow one part one large cow & heifer.

Item third I will bequeath to my Grand daughter Sarah Stringfellow daughter of Benjamin Stringfellow one clock & the lamp from Christ time hundred Dollars also one half the interest which I have or may have in the Contemplated land lottery.

Item fourth I will (and bequeath unto my Grand son George Stringfellow son of Robert Stringfellow) Thirty Dollars not to be paid him till he attains the age of twenty one years.

Item fifth I cause the balance of my property to be equally divided between my Children.

Item sixth I trust at present my beloved friend Ezekiel Farris my Executor to this my last Will & Testament making all previous Wills or Wills by me made, void.

Ezekiel O Park's Will

In the name of God Amen I Ezekiel O Park of Greene County in the State of Georgia being in a lawfull & inform state of health and of sound (and disposing mind) memory (and) understanding Considering the certainty of death, and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs, and thereby to the better prepared to leave this world, without it shall please God to call me hence do therefore make and publish this my last will & Testament in manner following That is to say First It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid as soon as my executors hereinafter named can conveniently do so, and for the better enabling them to meet the demands against my Estate, I do hereby authorise and empower them to sell or manage my Estate either real or personal or such items as they may deem most beneficial to my Estate and they are hereby authorized to sell the same or any part thereof to make these my children for the sum in full and ample a sum as I could reasonably expect to have in life and done the same myself if the proceeds thereof to be applied to discharge of my just debts and to pay my executors those have had sufficient money Estate to pay the same

131 due they shall not sell the balance thereof without the Consent of my wife or writing under her hand
affidavit it is my Will that my wife Deborah Park shall possess all my Estate both real & personal
after all my just debts are paid that she may be enabled to support herself and each of our children as may
continue to live with her in decedent's Comfort (and) that she shall have the entire interest and benefit of all
my property as aforesaid (and) in case of any of our children should be present demand for anything
that can be spared from the Estate any of them that is married or may hereafter marry or get to the other
that my wife should be at liberty and requested to hand off to such child or children with the
advice of my Executor such part of my Estate either real or personal as can be reasonably spared from
my Estate having due regard to the principles of Equity (and) that property so given out to be accounted for in
a final division of my Estate.

Thirdly it is my will and desire that my two boys Joseph and Dayton shall have a liberal Education
Dayton at any rate of his own funds are not sufficient (to) stop the continuance of the family will enable him
to graduate.

Fourthly It is my will and desire that at the death or intermarriage of my wife that all my Estate then remain
my shall be sold by any Executors at public Auction giving at least Thirty days public notice in some public
newspaper convenient to where the Estate may be which property shall be sold on a credit of at least twelve
months (and) the sales when collected shall be equally divided amongst my Children having regard to
what any of my Children may have previous to such sale received from my Estate (and) it is my
will that any of my Children shall be competent to bid for property at the sale of my Estate either
by themselves or Confidential Agent. And it is also my will that my Executors shall have an exclusive
claim or interest upon all property purchased by my Children or their agents as a Collateral security
for settlement of my Estate.

Fifthly I do hereby Constitute and appoint my Sons James S Park, John G Park (and) Son in law
Peter J Williams Executor of this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking all others by me heretofore
made. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this nineteenth day of
December in the year of Our Lord one thousand Eight hundred (and) twenty six
