In witness it may legally concern, be it hereby known that I have perfectly sound in Mind and memory do make my last Will Testament as follows viz

1st To my beloved wife Sarah of the business one I give during her life the lot at Cornistborough on which I live, with Sampson, Liddy and Seimas, with her child also two Slaves, two Cows, what she wants my Borough her Kitchen Furniture Bedded Transition in the House with two Beds furnished & 200 Dollars I advise her not to keep a House, but to Read her property alive with some of my Daughters at her & their option.

2nd To my son Doniger M. Gummens I give my tract or Lot of Land N. 11th. down in district 18th Early County

3rd To my son Francis D. Gummens my Grand son William G. Park I give jointly & equally my land called Shady Grove in Bethany Town County on the Waters of oge chus 50th Acres more or less

4th To my Grandson Francis G. McHenry, Francis L. Pufon, Francis Bunch, Rebecca Baldwin, I give in common & equally my tract of Land in Gwinnett County N. 130. on Downing Creek.

5th To my Daughter Rebecca Bouchell, I give my Negro woman Phillis

To my Daughter Elizabeth McKinly, I give my Negro woman Liddy

To my Daughter Esther Fish, I give my Negro woman Charlotte

To my Daughter Damaris Baldwin, I give my Negro woman Luina

To my Daughter Hannah G. Boardman I give my Negro woman Leinas

To my son Doniger M. Gummens my Negro Man Sampson

To my son Francis D. Gummens I give my Negro Man Marcus

To my Grandson William G. Park I give my Negro Boy George

To Dr. H. C. McHenry's son Rev. Henry I leave Henry Gummens's child untill he be 20 Years old then to be free He was born on the 26th of December 1825. I wish him learned to read & be good

To my Negro woman Sarah I leave her freedom & recommend her to the kind care of my children, all whom she helped to nurse

Let the Remainder of my Goods be fairly tilled as well as may be and taken by lottery among my Children, the oldest choosing first.
7th If my sisters Elizabeth and Jean Cummings of Tennessee, I give \$1000 to the surviving one of them.

8th All the remainder of my Estate, I leave to be sold and the proceeds to be equally divided between my Children, Rebecca, Benjamin, Elizabeth, Esther, Samaria, Hannah my Grandsons, William C. Fish, and Francis D. Cummings (son of my son of the same Name) if he be living & can be found. The share of this last mentioned Grandson is left to the trust of the Rev. Dr. Ezra Fish of Cohoes, in N. York. If Francis D. Cummings be not living or cannot be found, then I give his intended share equally to said Dr. E. Fish & the American Bible Society.

9th At the death of my beloved wife, alias Widow, let all her property kept her in this Will that she has not disposed of be sold, and the proceeds be equally divided among my Children or their legitimate Representatives.

10 If any of my Heirs die without lawful Issue of his or her or Body let their ones share be the common property of surviving Heirs. My Daughter Fish is exempted from the operation of this article. My son Benjamin H. Cummings Dr. Arch. C. McKinley, James C. McKinley, Benjamin Torrey & Joel James Smith are empowered & requested to execute the Will, and all previous Wills are hereby revoked given or subscribed under my hands this 21st Oct. 1829
