In the name of God amen I George Stovall of the County of Greene being in sound mind and memory yet calling to mind the Certainty of death and the uncertainty of life doth make this my last Will and testament revoking all other Wills or testaments heretofore by me made (to wit) I give and bequeath to my Wife Polly Stovall all my Estate both real and personal during her widowhood and all my Children to be Educated out of the real proceeds arising therefrom and if it should be the pleasure of my Wife at any time to dispose of any Species of property to any one or more of my Children that the value thereof shall be ascertained by my Executors herein after mentioned and a true record kept thereof that when an Equal Distribution shall take place Among all my Children that such property given shall be a part of their Legacy Also my Tract of Land lying in Wilkinson County in the twentieth District there containing two hundred and ninety five acres to father Walden should be sold on a term of twelve months and the money arising therefrom for the benefit of my wife and Children and if my wife should marry after her widowhood it is then my will that she should take the third part of the my Estate real and personal and the other two to be equally divided among all my Children and after the death of my wife to be divided in like manner and I rely I do hereby constitute and appoint John Weller John Wilborn and my wife Polly Stovall and John Stovall my son Executors of this my last will and testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal affixed my seal this 20<sup>th</sup> day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and fifteen
