Henry Baldwin's Will

I Henry Baldwin of the County of Greene in the State of Georgia do hereby certify that as all mortal men be subject to many perils diseases & sicknesses & uncertain what time they shall depart out of this life therefore to the intent they may be always in readiness to die whenever it shall please the allmighty god to call them to eternity & from the dust they came to the dust they must return in the name of God amen. Now his g. all do in witness & form following to wit

Item (1) I give unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Baldwin one negro woman by name Suti one negro woman by name Nancy one negro boy by name Sebern one girl child by name Mury & the land whereon I now live beginning on the Creek on a swampy rising up the Creek to the mouth of Bowden's spring branch to Bowden spring to the corner running a North East course to a stake corner running round to the beginning corner & two beds of furniture one desk & one black walnut table one pine slab & contents one horse pack one black wale chest & this is hers so long as her widow's hood I know longer & if she marries for the above named property to return to the estate again & be equally divided between my surviving children

Item (2) I give & bequeath to my daughter Lucy Reed one moiety of my estate

Item (3) I give & bequeath to my daughter Fimelady Wade one moiety of my estate

Item (4) I give & bequeath unto my son Joseph Hunt one moiety of my estate

Item (5) I give & bequeath to my daughter Susan Beck one moiety of my estate

Item (6) I give & bequeath unto my daughter Rebecca one moiety of my estate

Item (7) I give & bequeath unto my daughter Harriet one moiety of moiety of all and one hundred dollars to be paid out of my estate

Item (8) I wish the balance of my estate to be repaid to be paid out until my son John Baldwin becomes of age & then all of them to be sold with all the best of my estate to wit horses cattle hogs & the household & kitchen furniture plants & all together with one piece of land in location hereafter described N^o 19 together with the balance of this tract &c

Item (9) I do hereby nominate my beloved wife together with Robert Pomeroy my

executors of this my last will & testament making nullifying all former wills & testaments heretofore made nullifying & conforming this & this only as my last will & testament given under my hand & seal this 24th day of April of our Lord eighteen hundred twenty three signed & delivered in presence of us

In the name of God amen. I Thomas Grees of the County of Greene State of Georgia being weak in body but of sound mind & memory blessed be Almighty God for the same do publish this my last will & testament in manner & form as follows viz.

First I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Leticia Grees the plantation whereon I now live with all the appertinances thereto belonging with all the plantation tools household & kitchen furniture stock & all kinds except that part of the horses that my son John Jr. & others may have a share or likewise one gig & harness or one cart one negro man named Edenborough one diller named Tom one ditto named Master one negro woman named Sarah one ditto Binney one negro girl named Lilloj Grees I also give to my eldest son Thomas Grees one half of two tracts of land containing in all three hundred & thirty six acres adjoining the cone in the fourth district with thereon being also one negro man named Tom one ditto named Peter one boy named Bill one ditto named Andrew
