compensation for his services to be fixed by the Court of ordinary of
Greene County.

Seventhly

It is my wish and desire that my Brother Patrick Leonard and his
Wife Sally be allowed a support out of the property bequeathed to their
children but that said property is to be in no way liable to the payment
of their debts.

Eighthly

It is my wish that as any of the children of my said friends
may or arrive at lawful age that my Brother Frederick
Leonard give him her or them and equal portion of the
property bequeathed to them respectively.

Ninthly

I hereby appoint my well beloved Brother
Frederick Leonard sole executor of this will -
