Isaac Bidell Will.

Georgia
Greene County } In the name of Almighty God, I, Isaac

I, Isaac Bidell of the County and State aforesaid being in full body, health, but of sound disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament, (thoroughly revoking all wills formerly made by me) in manner and form following - Viz.

Item 1st
I desire that all my just debts be paid.

Item 2nd
I desire that my Children Micajah Bidell, Thomas J. Bidell, and Joseph Bidell, constitute & compose three of the legates to my Estate; that all the Children of my deceased daughter Ruth Beckham together constitute & compose another legate; And that all the Children of my deceased daughter Clarissa Johnson constitute & compose another legate, thus making five legates to my Estate, so that each of the two families of Children of my two deceased daughters Ruth Beckham and Clarissa Johnson stand exactly in the same footing as their father would do if living and unmarried. And as each Child of these two respective families of Children shall marry or arrive at the age of Twenty one years then they draw their Shares respectively.

Item 3rd
I desire that John A. Beckham the former husband of my deceased daughter Ruth, upon his giving to the Court of Ordinary good and sufficient security, receive into his care and possession the property that may be due to his Children by this my will, and that he be allowed to use and dispose of the same as he may see fit and benefit the persons of the said property, that is to say the services of the property and the interest of the money constituting

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233 his Executors are entitled to it by managing or answering at the age of Twenty one years. And in like manner I desire that Peter to Dickinson the former husband of my deceased daughter Eleanor upon his giving like security receive and use in like manner the property that may descend to his children.
Item 4th

I desire that all my servants, except Rillah, be appointed by five discreet men whom my executors may appoint and be put into as many lots as there are legatees, and the share of each legatee be drawn for. Should the lot not be equal in value, those legatees drawing the most valuable lots share pay back to those of the less valuable lots, so as to make them equal among my legatees.
Item 5th

I desire that the residue of my perishable property be sold at public sale, and the proceeds of it be equally divided between my legatees.
Item 6th

I desire that my land be sold by my Executors in that way they may think most advantageous to the estate, either public or private in separate parcels or the whole; and the proceeds of it together with all debts due to me be equally divided between my legatees.
Item 7th

I desire that my old servant Lucy be supported as long as she lives by my legatees.
Item 8th

I give and bequeath to my son Micajah Beadell my servant woman Rillah.
Item 9th

I do hereby constitute and appoint my two sons Micajah Beadell and Joseph Beadell Executors to this my last will and testament.

In Testimony of the being my last will & Testament I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the Thirtieth day of October Eighteen Hundred and Thirty Six.
