Greene County In the name of God my Creator Amen. I John Stepp being sick
 3rd Octo 1825 weak of body but of a sound mind disposing memory, desirous and desirous
 this my last Will and Testament in manner following,

First My Will and desire is that all my just debts be paid

I leave and leaving wife Martha Stepp my plantation wherewⁿ I now live during her natural
 life, also I leave to my leaving wife all my household and Kitchen furniture all my stock of every
 description also all my plantation stock of every description. And at her death I give and
 bequeath the aforesaid plantation all furniture stock &c of every description which the said
 Martha Stepp may not make use of for the support of herself during her natural life to my son
 Stephen Stepp to him and his heirs forever. I do also constitute Robert Booth Stephen Stepp my sole &
 sole Execut^r of the my last will and Testament and I do hereby disallow and revoke any and every
 form or form, Testaments, Wills, or legacies ever bequeathed by me in any way before or after
 this Will^r whereof I have hereunto set my hand affixed my seal the day and year above written
