 Item I leave my loving wife Martha Stepp my plantation whereon I now live during her natural life, also I leave to my loving wife all my household and kitchen furniture all my stock of every description also all my plantation stock of every description and at her death I give and bequeath the aforesaid plantation all furniture and stock of every description which the said Martha Stepp may not make use of for the support of herself during her natural life to my son Stephen Stepp to him and his heirs forever I do also constitute Robert North to Stephen Stepp my sole executor of this my last will and Testament (and I do hereby disallow and revoke any and every form or forms, Testaments, Wills, or legacies ever bequeathed by me in any ways before whatever time or times whereof I have hitherto set my hand and affixed my seal the day and year above written Assigned sealed & delivered in the presence of)
