Item 3rd I give & bequeath unto my granddaughter Elizabeth Sims one
negro girl named Harriett
Item 4th I give & bequeath unto my granddaughter Sims one negro
girl named Susanah
Item 5th I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Sims ten dollars
Item 6th I give & bequeath unto my grandson William Mitchell
fifty dollars All other property that I am possessed of after
the payment of my just debts is to be sold at best bidder &
the proceeds equally divided between my sons Daniel Mitchell
Edward Mitchell Isaac Mitchell & my daughter Eliza
S. Mellow after deductions from her part the value of one
negro girl named Harriett & also my grandsons Thomas C
Greenwood Eldridge L. Greenwood William M. Greenwood
James D. Greenwood one equal share with those above
mentioned I appoint Isaac Mitchell & William Wells
of the State of Georgia & County of Greene executors to this my
last will & testament which I have hereunto set my hand
& seal this the 18th day of March 1825
