I give That I do leave to my beloved wife Nancy Atkin all my Estate during her life widowhood but if she marry I do still (lend) to her her lifetime one half of my Estate (and also my negro boy Peter & his Cows (and) Calves (and) as her marriage all the balance of of my property to be (sold) (and) equally divided among my children (and) if she (should) not marry it is my will that all my Estate be kept together for the uses of raising & educating my Children until the death of my wife (and) then to be (sold) (and) equally divided among all of my Children John (and) Elijah (and) Sallie (and) Temperance (and) Eliza Atkin Jacob Atkin Edmond Atkin James Atkin & Mary Atkin. It is also my will that at any time during my Estate being kept together that my Executors do sell any part of of my Estate as they may think is for the best (and) I do also appoint my wife Nancy Atkin (and) Angel. Morris (and) John Atkin as my Executors And where I have set my hand (and) Seal this 19th day of June 1820
