State of Georgia? I James Hallin of the State (and) County of Greene County? I am appointed unto all men once to die, (and) believing it to be my duty to prepare for this great event by making my peace with God (and) arranging by disposing of my worldly property being weak in body but sound in mind (and) to as far as possible any disagreeable consequences from arising in the settlement my Estate after my decease in the name of God I make this my last will and testament in the manner (and) form following
1st I commit my Soul to God (and) my body to be decently buried
2nd It is my will, that after my decease my Executors pay off all my just debts
3rd It is my will that all the property I got with my beloved wife shall be divided to her (to wit) Two negroes Minst, Sall and her two children Mares Weston with all the Cattle (and) a sufficient number of Hogs with all the I got with her (and) one Colro, all the Horses I got with her (and) one Colro to wit a
It is also my will that she (should) have a sufficiency of Corn (and) fodder for her stock out of the present growing Crop when it is (sowed). It is also my will that my well and the Campbells (and) made ready for spending together with the plantation (and) other stands (and) to my wife the Cost (and) expenses of rebuilding (and) mill to be paid by Executors after deducting the amount of certain notes which I received with my wife (and) one note upon Moses Cambell for one hundred (and) fifty dollars (and) one other to upon Arch Swann for seventeen (dollars) from the nett Cost of (and) rebuilding
4th It is my will that the remainder of my property ^{with realty & furniture} be equally divided among my beloved children viz Radford, Gilbert, Garrett, Sidney, Nancy and Waleg Hallin & Annot. I do not wish my negroes sold if a fair division can be made without
5th It is my wish that my property should be kept together as long as my Executors wish it would be (advantageous & profitable for my dear children
6th I hereby appoint (and) Ordain Richard Asbury (and) my son Radford Hallin Executors of this my last will (and) Testament. In testimony that the above is my last will and testament I hereunto subscribe my name (and) affix my seal this twenty fifth day of May in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred & Eighteen

5th Lastly I do hereby nominate (and appoint my loving Friends John Coleman and John Tremble Executors to this my last will and Testament Revoking all others

that I may have heretofore made (and declaring this to be my only will) and testifying whereof I have herunto set my hand and Seal this 1st day of November 1819
