my duty to prepare for this great event by making my peace with God (and) arranging
my disposing of my worldly property being weak in body but sound in mind and to
leave as far as possible any disagreeable consequences from arising in the settlement
of my estate after my decease in the name of God I make this my last will and
testament in the manner (and) form following
I do command my Soul to God who gave it (and) my body to be decently buried
in the ground as my will, that after my decease my Executors pay off all my just debts
I do command that all the property I go to with my beloved wife shall
belong to her (to wit) Four negroes (one) black, (one) white two Children Moses
Illustrus with all the cattle (and) a sufficient number of Negroes with all the
I go to with her (and) one extra all the horses I go to with her (and) one extra to me
It is also my will that she (should) have a sufficiency of Corn (and) fodder for
what out of the present growing Crop when it is (sown). It is also my will that my mill
and the Plantation (and) made ready for grinding together with the plantation wherein
stands it return to my wife the Cost (and) expences of rebuilding (and) mill to be paid by
Executors after deducting the amount of certain notes which I received with my wife
and) One note upon Moses Lambill for one hundred (and) fifty dollars (and) one other
upon And Swans for seventeen (Dollars) from the note Cost of (and) Rebuilding
it. It is my will that the remainder of my property be equally divided among
my beloved Children my Rutherford, Gilbert, Garrett, Sidney, Nancy and Belzy (and) others
in proportion. I do not wish any negroes note if a fair division can be made without
so doing.

It is my wish that my property should be kept together as long as my Executors
will it would be (advantageous) & profitable for my dear Children
I hereby Appoint (and) certain Richard Asbury (and) my son (and) his friends Trustees
of this my last will (and) testament. In testimony that the above is my last will and
testament I hereunto subscribe my name and affix my seal this twenty fifth day of
June in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred & eighteen
